The living wage shown is the hourly rate that an **individual** in a household must earn to support themselves and/or their family, working full-time, or 2080 hours per year. This table provides living wage estimates for individuals and households with one or two working adults and zero to two children. In households with two working adults, all hourly values reflect what one working adult requires to earn to meet their families' basic needs, assuming the other adult also earns the same.

At its simplest, a **living wage** is what one full-time worker must earn on an hourly basis to help cover the cost of their family's minimum basic needs where they live while still being self-sufficient. Here's a quick guide for what you need to know about the living wage data you see on the calculator.

The degree to which a community exhibits certain social conditions, including high poverty, low percentage of vehicle access, or crowded households, may affect that community's ability to prevent human suffering and financial loss in the event of disaster. These factors describe a community's social vulnerability. The social vulnerability index is a measure of the degree of social vulnerability in counties and neighborhoods across the United States, where a higher score indicates higher vulnerability. The report area has a social vulnerability index score 0.60, which is greater than the state average of 0.43.

Many things influence how well and how long we live. Health Factors represent those things we can improve to live longer and healthier lives. They are indicators of the future health of our communities. No single factor determines an individual's or community's health. Instead, intersecting factors – from air and water quality to housing conditions – create overall health. We highlight opportunities for improvement by summarizing the health of nearly every county in the nation across four Health Factors: Health Behaviors, Clinical Care, Social and Economic Factors, and Physical Environment.

- **Health Behaviors** – including alcohol and drug use, diet and exercise, sexual activity and tobacco use.
- **Clinical Care** – including health care access and quality
- **Social and Economic Factors** – including education, employment, income, family and social support and community safety.
- **Physical Environment** – including air and water quality, housing and transit.

Health Behaviors – health related practices, such as diet and exercise, that can improve or damage the health of individuals or community members. Health behaviors are determined by the choices available in the places where people live, learn, work, and play. Not everyone has the money, access and privilege needed to make healthy choices. Our measures of Food Insecurity and Access to Exercise Opportunities can help communities learn where people may be living without the resources they need to thrive and make healthy choices. Communities need policies and programs that ensure reliable access to nutritious food and exercise opportunities.

Clinical Care – anything related to the direct medical treatment or testing of patients. Access to affordable, quality health care can prevent disease and lead to earlier disease detection. Communities are living longer lives because of breakthroughs in clinical care, such as advancements in vaccinations, surgical procedures and preventative screenings. Nearly 30 million people in the United States have no medical health insurance. Care is limited by high deductibles, language differences, long distances and long wait times to reach providers and specialists. Telemedicine has improved access for some people. Limited or low-quality care can lead to delayed diagnoses and treatments, worse health outcomes, lower quality of life and shorter lives. Access to care and quality of care vary for racialized groups of people and by place and income. The measures of Clinical Care can help us understand how access differs between counties and within counties.

Social and Economic Factors – affect how well and how long we live. Social and economic factors include factors such as income, education, employment, community safety and social support. The choices that are available in a community are impacted by social and economic factors. These choices include our abilities to afford medical care and housing and to manage stress. Social and economic opportunities help communities live longer and healthier lives. For example, a living wage shapes opportunities for housing, education, childcare, food and medical care. We do not always think about social and economic factors when we think about health. However, strategies to improve these factors can have a greater impact on health than strategies that target individual behaviors. Communities that have been cut off from investments or who have experienced discrimination have fewer social and economic opportunities. These gaps disproportionately affect people of color and people living in rural areas. Children may be especially impacted.

Physical Environment – where individuals live, learn, work and play. People interact with their physical environment through the air they breathe, the water they drink, the homes in which they live and the transportation they use. There are stark differences in the opportunities to live in healthy physical environments between counties and within counties. This is especially true for people with low incomes and for people of color. These differences exist because of the long legacy of discrimination, disinvestment and exploitation in the United States. The differences are rooted in systems, policies and practices such as redlining, predatory lending, corporate industrial abuses and legacies of broken land treaties and genocide. Clean air and safe water are necessary for good health. Air pollution is associated with increased asthma rates and lung diseases and an increase in premature deaths from heart and lung disease. Contaminated water can lead to illness, infection and increased risks of cancer. Stable, affordable housing can provide a safe environment for families to live, learn and grow. However, housing is often a family's largest expense. When rent or mortgage payments are too high, families are forced to make difficult choices between paying for other essentials such as utilities, food, transportation or medical care.



Population Below the Poverty Level, Percent by County, SAIPE 2023






Married Family Households Living Below the Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-23






Single Parent Family Households Living Below the Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-23





Population Below Poverty Level, Children (Ages 0-4), Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-2023







Population Below the Poverty Level, Children (Ages 5-17), Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-2023





Population with Income Below 185% FPL, Percent



Population Below 185% Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-23







Population Below 200% Poverty Level, Children (Age 0-17), Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-2023







Ages 65 and Up Poverty Rate



Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2019-2023




